Sajal Mathur joined the Centre for WTO Studies at the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade in July 2011. He is on special leave from the WTO Secretariat headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland. Mr. Mathur has worked at the WTO from 1997/1998 after completing his studies in Economics from Delhi University (St. Stephens' College), Jawaharlal Nehru University and the London School of Economics (specialization in Environment and Development Economics).

Mr. Mathur has extensive experience on trade and development issues having previously worked in the Development Division and the Technical Cooperation & Training Division of the WTO (1998-2004). Prior to joining the Centre for WTO Studies, Sajal Mathur was Counsellor in the Accessions Division working on the WTO membership package of several least developed, developing and transition economies (2004-2011). He was Secretary of the WTO Working Parties on the Accession of Afghanistan, Bahamas, Bhutan, Iraq, Lao PDR, Seychelles, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Yemen.

Mr. Mathur has delivered training programs for senior officials and served as a resource person in workshops and conferences across the world. He has drafted documentation for several WTO committees and bodies and has written papers on Increasing the Participation of Developing and Least Developed Countries (LDCs) in the Multilateral Trading System, Market Access for LDCs, Trade Measures with Environmental Effects, Special and Differential Treatment for Developing and LDCs, and the Accession of LDCs. He has also written a guest column for the Economic Times (1998) and has contributed in publications on "Trade and Health" (WHO, 2004) and the Handbook on Accession to the WTO (Cambridge University Press, 2008).

At the Centre for WTO Studies, Professor Mathur will be focusing on NTBs, Trade and Environment, SPS, TBT, RTAs, Accessions and the TPRs of WTO Members.
