- Why notifications?
  - Monitor implementation and compliance
  - Transparency
  - Used in dispute settlement panels
- > Who examines them?
  - Committee on Agriculture
  - Experts in capitals
  - General public (Internet)



# **Types of Notifications**

- Market access
  - Tariff quota administration Table MA:1
  - Imports under tariff quotas Table MA:2
  - Special safeguard Tables MA:3 to MA:5
- Domestic support
  - Green Box, Article 6.2, Blue Box, AMS Table DS:1
  - New or modified exempt measures Table DS:2
- Export subsidies Tables ES:1 to ES:3
- Export prohibitions and restrictions Table ER:1
- ➤ Follow-up to the NFIDC Decision Table NF:1

# **Domestic Support Notifications**

- > No reduction commitment
  - Statement that no domestic support used (Table DS:1)
  - Or relevant Supporting Tables DS:1 to DS:9 if Green Box, Blue Box, Article 6.2 or any de minimis support
- Reduction commitment
  - Table DS:1 and Supporting Tables DS:1 to DS:9 indicating domestic support use, including Green Box, Blue Box, Article 6.2, de minimis or AMS support
- ➤ Table DS:2 notification of new or modified measures exempt from reduction —

Ad hoc notifications

LDCs notify every two years

# **Export Subsidy Notifications**

- > No reduction commitment
  - Statement that no export subsidies used (Table ES:1)
  - If developing country Member using certain export subsidies pursuant to Article 9.4 – submit Supporting Table ES:2
  - If significant exporter, submit Table ES:2
- > Reduction commitment
  - Table ES:1 and Supporting Tables ES:1indicating export subsidy use
  - Table ES:2 list of products and volume of total exports/
- > Food aid donors
  - Table ES:3 indicating total volume of food aid provided

# Monitoring & Surveillance discussions

#### **Mandate:**

Current Article 18 of the AoA to be amended.

- Enhanced monitoring and surveillance (M&S) of commitments
- Special emphasis on the role of M&S with respect to the Green Box



## Monitoring & Surveillance discussions

Main points (Annex M of the Revised Draft Modalities for Agriculture):

- Committee on Agriculture (CoA) to review and monitor the implementation of Member's commitments
- Review or monitoring of commitments primarily through notifications
- Supplementary documentation by the Secretariat, if requested by the CoA, to facilitate review process
- Current Article 18 of the AoA to be amended.
  - Covering new rules/commitments like the SSM or the OTDS or product-specific AMS or Blue Box caps
  - Enhanced monitoring through additional requirements like comprehensive oneoff notification describing the existing Green Box programmes
  - Thematic review and surveillance like of the implementation of cotton-related commitments
- Technical assistance to developing country Members



Review of the M&S mechanism after 3 years.

# Scheduling issues

- Schedules includes Member's concessions and commitments
- DDA agriculture outcome would be reflected in revised rules as well in the revised schedules
- Post-DDA schedules would result in:
  - Deepening of the existing concessions and commitments through 'reduction commitments' (eg. Bound tariffs or Total AMS)
  - Inclusion of new or additional concessions and commitments (e.g. Bound OTDS Level or productspecific AMS and Blue Box caps)



# Scheduling issues (Contd.)

- Formats or templates for Schedules as well supporting tables (AGST)
- Supporting data, for example value of total agriculture production (VoP)
- Submission of draft schedules as well supporting documentation using the agreed templates, in accordance with the provisions of the Modalities,
- Multilateral verifications of schedules (important role of supporting data)
- Technical assistance by the Secretariat
- Finalization of the Schedules (which would then become part of the WTO Agreement)
