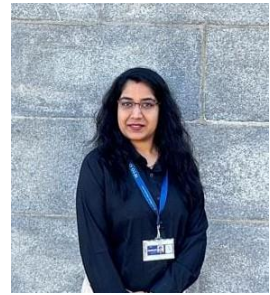


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Professional Bio

Khyati Goyal is an international trade policy professional with extensive experience in WTO agriculture negotiations and multilateral trade policy. Khyati holds an M.Sc. in International Business Economics & Finance from the Gokhale Institute of Politics & Economics and a B.A. (Hons.) in Economics from Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi. She began her professional career in the Trade Policy Division – Agriculture of the Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, where she worked as a Research Associate and subsequently as a Young Professional before taking up her current role as an Associate in 2025.

In her current role, Khyati works extensively on WTO agriculture negotiations, with particular focus on Public Stockholding for food security, domestic support disciplines, Special and Differential Treatment, and broader WTO reform issues. She has prepared questions, interventions, briefing notes, talking points and analytical inputs for India's participation in the WTO Committee on Agriculture and other WTO forums, and has undertaken detailed analysis of Members' submissions, notifications and negotiating proposals. Her work also includes quantitative and qualitative assessment of agricultural domestic support, FBTAMS entitlements, the Bali Peace Clause, and convergence and divergence among WTO Members' positions.

Khyati has contributed to India's 8th WTO Trade Policy Review and to preparations for the Fourteenth WTO Ministerial Conference (MC14), where she participated as a member of the Indian Delegation. She also represented the Department at the 115th meeting of the WTO Committee on Agriculture in May 2026. In addition, she has contributed to BRICS-related engagements, including the BRICS Contact Group on Economic and Trade Issues and the BRICS Agriculture Working Group, and has prepared policy inputs and briefing material for various high-level domestic and international trade engagements.

Through her professional experience, Khyati has developed specialised expertise in WTO agriculture, domestic support, food security, multilateral trade negotiations and WTO reform, combining economic analysis with evidence-based policy research to support India's negotiating positions and broader trade policy objectives.
