Debashish Lahiri is a Consultant (Legal) at the Centre for WTO Studies, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, providing legal analysis on India's engagement with the multilateral trading system.

Mr. Lahiri holds an LL.M. in Intellectual Property Law from the National Law University, Jodhpur (2015–16), and a B.A. LL.B. from Jamia Millia Islamia (2006–12). He has since continued to build on this academic foundation through specialised coursework in Artificial Intelligence Law and Ethics at NLU Jodhpur (2025) and an Advanced International Certificate Course in Intellectual Property Law at the Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology (KAIST) (2026), alongside a WTO e-Learning badge in Dispute Resolution.

His professional experience spans both enforcement and research. He served as Associate Manager at the Office of the Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (CGPDTM) (2023–24), and as Research Associate at the Competition Commission of India (2019–23), where he worked closely on the practical application of intellectual property and competition law. He began his legal career as an advocate and legal assistant in Delhi, including roles with the Government of Delhi and in private practice (2014–18).
