

## Brief Bio

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Dr. Amit Randev is a Consultant (Legal) at the Centre for WTO Studies (CWS), Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT). At CWS, he actively contributes to India's engagement at the WTO and supports the Indian Government in international trade negotiations, legal advisory, and policy formulation. His areas of work include WTO reforms and disputes, trade remedial measures (Antidumping, Countervailing and Safeguards), industrial policy and non-tariff measures (NTMs).

Amit has nearly a decade of professional experience across government, industry, academia, and private practice. Prior to joining CWS, he served as an Associate Director at SBA Group Solicitors & Consultants, where he represented Indian and international businesses on trade remedy investigations, cross-border trade disputes, and regulatory matters before various jurisdictions including the U.S. Department of Commerce (USDOC) and the European Commission (EC). He has also worked at Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) and the Jindal Group, as an in-house legal counsel leading trade remedial litigation.

He has served as the Programme Lead for the Centre for WTO Studies–World Trade Institute (WTI), Joint Academy (a flagship capacity-building initiative in international trade law and policy). Additionally, he is a Member of the Advisory Board at RMLNLU (Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow) Law Review.

Amit has presented research papers at international conferences organised by leading academic institutions and international organisations, including the University of Oxford, Jagiellonian University (Poland), Texas A&M University (USA), and WTO Chairs Conference. Amit holds a Ph.D. in International Trade Law, an LL.M. in Corporate and Commercial Laws and has qualified the University Grants Commission–National Eligibility Test (UGC–NET) in law.
