Dr. Kishor Jadhav is an economist, presently working as a Consultant at the Centre for WTO Studies, established by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, at the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade. Dr. Jadhav is currently deputed to the Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, New Delhi.

With over a decade of experience in international trade and WTO matters, Dr. Jadhav provides research, economic analysis, and policy support on bilateral and multilateral trade issues, with a focus on Trade-in-Goods, Rules of Origin, and Non-Agricultural Market Access at the WTO. He has contributed technical inputs to the Trade-in-Goods negotiations of several of India's major trade agreements, including the India-EU FTA, India-UK CETA, India-EFTA TEPA, India-Australia ECTA, and RCEP, covering market access analysis, and stakeholder consultations. He has also contributed to the Rules of Origin track under the India-Mauritius CECPA.

Dr. Jadhav is currently engaged in India's ongoing FTA negotiations, including with the Maldives, Chile, EAEU, Israel, and Australia. His research interests include trade policy, market access in trade in goods, tariff policy, and trade-related research, with publications in peer-reviewed SCOPUS- and ABDC-indexed journals and a book chapter. He has presented at international conferences, including the 20th GLOBELICS Anniversary Conference and the 8th IIFT International Conference, and has completed WTO e-learning certificate courses with Distinction. Dr. Jadhav holds a Ph.D. from the Central University of Gujarat.
