Dr Saheli Das is presently working as a Senior Research Fellow at CWS, where she provides analytical inputs to the Government of India on international trade policy and negotiations. Saheli leads the trade-in-goods analysis for India's foreign trade with North East Asia. Her wider areas of focus include trade data analysis, forecasting, export competitiveness, dumping risks, retaliation strategies, sustainability, etc. Prior to her posting at CWS, she worked in the Trade Intelligence and Analytics Wing at Department of Commerce, where she contributed to monthly press briefs, build India's Trade Barometer Index, forecasted India's export performance, and deep dive to sector and country specific trade analysis to find new markets and new products for India. Dr Das also designed the training material for the Centre's e-Modules on Trade Analytics. Saheli has previously worked in TERI, IGC, and ICRIER. She has presented her research at international conferences including WCERE, INSEE, ISI, and at Research Symposium at University of Sussex. Dr Das has published varied research articles in journals, newspapers, and online platforms. She has contributed to many policy briefs related to SDGs. She holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Jawaharlal Nehru University and a M.A. in Economics from University of Hyderabad.
