Divyansh Dua is a Young Professional (Economics) at the Centre for WTO Studies, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT), New Delhi. His work focuses on international trade and trade policy, with experience in government procurement, trade in goods and services, and rules of origin.

As part of his current role, he has assisted the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, in FTA negotiations, particularly in the area of Government Procurement. He has also contributed to policy-oriented research and quantitative assessments of trade agreements, including studies on tariff liberalisation, trade potential, and the economic impact of proposed trade arrangements. His work involves the use of quantitative and econometric methods, including Partial Equilibrium and Gravity models, and analysis using international trade databases.

He holds a Master's degree in Economics from the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics and a Bachelor's degree in Economics from the University of Delhi. His broader research interests include international trade, trade policy, economic modelling, and evidence-based policy research to support India's negotiating positions and broader trade policy objectives.
