## Specialised Course on Trade Remedies under WTO

## (Anti-Dumping, Subsidies, Safeguards), TRIMS, Dispute Settlement and RTAs

## 15 – 24 January, 2018

The Centre for WTO Studies (CWS) organized a "Specialised Course on Trade Remedies under WTO (Anti-Dumping, Subsidies, Safeguards), TRIMS, Dispute Settlement and RTAs" from 15-24 January 2018 in collaboration with the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Programme of Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.
